MEDICO LEGAL EXPERIENCE:

Mr Budd is a Consultant Spinal Surgeon and Clinical Lead for Spinal Surgery at the Royal Devon University Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust. He is a UK-trained specialist with extensive experience in the diagnosis, management and surgical treatment of spinal conditions. He has a special interest in Cauda Equina Syndrome (CES).

In addition to his clinical role, Mr Budd has a well-established medico-legal practice and has been acting as an independent expert witness for seven years. He has prepared hundreds of reports for both Claimant and Defendant instructions and is experienced in matters relating to personal injury and clinical negligence litigation.

He has completed formal medico-legal training, including the Bond Solon Civil Law Certificate and prepares reports in accordance with CPR Part 35 and relevant court guidance. His opinions are recognised for being independent, balanced and evidence-based, with clear explanation of medical issues for a legal audience.

Mr Budd has not had the opportunity to attend Court but has received summons for the Court. He previously has flew to Ireland for a trial which settled on the same day it was due to start.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE:

Mr Budd is based at the Princess Elizabeth Orthopaedic Centre. He is a UK-trained specialist with broad and comprehensive experience in the assessment and management of spinal disorders across the cervical, thoracic, and lumbar spine.

His clinical practice encompasses the full spectrum of degenerative, traumatic, infective, and complex spinal pathology, including cervical and lumbar disc disease, spinal stenosis, radiculopathy, myelopathy, spondylolisthesis, spinal deformity, vertebral fractures and Cauda Equina Syndrome (CES).

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He routinely manages both acute and chronic spinal conditions using evidence-based non-operative and operative strategies.

Mr Budd has extensive experience in spinal surgical procedures, including decompression surgery, discectomy, minimally invasive spinal techniques, and spinal fusion and stabilisation procedures. He regularly treats patients with complex spinal pathology, revision surgery, and post-operative complications and is experienced in managing failed back surgery and adjacent segment disease.

In his role as Clinical Lead, Mr Budd is responsible for service development, clinical governance, and quality assurance within the spinal service. He plays a key role in multidisciplinary working, collaborating closely with pain specialists, neurologists, radiologists, physiotherapists and spinal nurse specialists to deliver integrated patient-centred care.

Mr Budd is actively involved in teaching and training, contributing to the education of junior doctors, specialist trainees and allied healthcare professionals. He also participates in audit and service improvement initiatives to ensure the delivery of safe, effective, and contemporary spinal care.
