Clinical Negligence

- Medical malpractice and patient complaints
- Spinal anaesthesia
- Suprapubic catheter insertion
- Recurring urinary tract infections (UTIs)
- Misdiagnosis/mismanagement
- Advanced minimal access surgery
- Laparoscopic and hysteroscopic keyhole surgery:
 - Laparoscopic hysterectomy

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MEDICO LEGAL EXPERIENCE:

Mr Shoukrey is an experienced Consultant Obstetrician and Gynaecologist, serving as both Obstetric Risk Management Lead Consultant and Minimal Access Gynaecological Surgery Lead Consultant within his NHS Trust. He holds the Cardiff University Bond Solon (CUBS) Expert Witness Certificate, having successfully completed advanced training in Excellence in Report Writing, Cross-Examination, Courtroom Skills, and Civil Law and Procedure.

He has acted as an independent medical expert in a wide range of civil proceedings for both claimant and defendant solicitors, as well as in Family Court and Coroner's Court matters. His expert work encompasses clinical negligence, coronial investigations, child protection, and safeguarding cases involving obstetric and gynaecological care.

Mr Shoukrey has provided oral evidence in Court on numerous occasions and is fully conversant with the Civil Procedure Rules (Part 35) and the professional responsibilities of an expert witness. He is recognised for producing clear, balanced, and evidence-based reports that meet the required legal and professional standards.

In his capacity as Obstetric Risk Management Lead Consultant, he has undertaken and led root cause analyses, serious incident investigations, and child death reviews, providing expert recommendations to improve patient safety and clinical governance. His medico-legal expertise is supported by his extensive practical experience in high-risk obstetrics, complex pregnancy management, and gynaecological surgery.

Mr Shoukrey prepares approximately 50 detailed expert reports each year, including screening, desktop, and full liability reports, and is known for his thoroughness, impartiality, and timely delivery. He maintains a consistent record of meeting court deadlines and provides expert input at all stages of litigation, from pre-action protocol through to trial.

This combination of specialised clinical experience, formal medico-legal training, and proven courtroom performance positions Mr Shoukrey as a highly respected and reliable expert witness in the field of Obstetrics and Gynaecology.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE:

Mr Shoukrey is a Consultant Obstetrician and Gynaecologist at Dorset County Hospital NHS Foundation Trust, a position he has held since 2011. He has practiced obstetrics and gynaecology for over 25 years since his qualification and holds a Master's Degree in Advanced Gynaecological Endoscopy from the University of Surrey.

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In his role as Obstetric Risk Management Lead Consultant at Dorset County Hospital, Mr Shoukrey investigates clinical risks and medical malpractice. He is also lead clinician for Minimal Access Gynaecological (keyhole) Surgery at Dorset County Hospital. Whilst there, he has introduced new surgical procedures including Total Laparoscopic Hysterectomy and Laparoscopic Resection of Endometriosis. He routinely performs general gynaecological surgical procedures, including abdominal and vaginal surgery. He also manages complex pregnancy, postnatal problems and childbirth, including caesarean sections and instrumental deliveries.

Mr Shoukrey teaches at the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists, including training doctors in laparoscopic/ hysteroscopic skills and emergency obstetrics including instrumental deliveries and shoulder dystocia. He is also a Royal College examiner, and has presented scientific research papers at both national and international meetings, with published articles in scientific journals in the field of minimal access surgery.
